They have been reassured that I will still be next door to support them if they need it, although they are in very capable hands next year. We have continued our learning about Space this week, by researching interesting facts using the internet and non-fiction books, we have identified the key features of nonfiction books and began writing our own non-fiction books all about everything we have learnt this half term. The children loved being called authors. We will continue writing these next week in literacy - they can't wait to bring home their very own books! In math's we looked at halves and quarters of shapes and numbers. Next week we will continue this and begin looking at capacity. We really enjoyed Space celebration day! We took part in circus skills, watched the circus and created our own spaceships out of junk modelling - it was so much fun!


Fistral: Fistral had a great 'Space Day' with lots of fun space activities, learning circus skills

Next week we are continuing our learning about light in science and in topic work we will be learning about villains of the past.

In English we are rewriting fairy tales from a different angle, changing the heroes and villains, and in maths we are exploring 2d shapes.

After a great introduction to one of Shakespeare's most famous stories, Pentire will be starting to focus on some of the key scenes from Romeo and Juliet looking at the key features that make up a play script. In maths, we will be looking at symmetry and creating symmetrical drawings using tracing paper and mirrors We will be finishing off our science unit by looking at some of the different ways we can make states of matter change.

During Literacy, in Marazion class, we will be continuing to innovate a legend linked to our topic 'Hola Mexico'. In maths we will be continuing to learn about properties of shapes. During topic year 5 pupils will be continuing to learn aspect of SRE. In science, Marazion class will be identifying and explaining irreversible chemical changes.
