Class news - what's happening

Kynance

A great last week for Kynance this week. We have been looking at writing whole sentences, using full stops, fingers spaces and capital letters. The children's reading is progressing fantastically, supported by the introduction of our home phonics books. Thank you to all of the parents engaging with this. If you missed this meeting, please see Miss Guy as it is important information potentially missed. Books will be changed when the children are read with, twice a week. These days will vary as different groups are read with at different times. A reminder to try to and avoid the children guessing or rehearsing the sentence, as they should be encouraged to 'sound it out' using their phonics. If you are unsure of how to say some sounds, such as 'ay' or 'ee', please see Miss Guy. We explain these sounds as 'special friends who hold each other's hands making one sound'. In Maths, we have been exploring 3D shapes and their properties. Please support this at home by naming common 3D shapes and identifying real-life 3D shapes. We have created a doctors role-play area which the children have loved, after explaining where Miss Guy has been. Thank you for your patience when I was off for a couple of days last week.

Gwithian:

A really lovely half term, ended with a super trip to the zoo. The children really enjoyed themselves and I hope they came home and told you all about it. Our next topic is Dinosaurs! We will be going back in time to find out about what they were like and how they became extinct. I'm sure it will be a really fascinating topic and I can't wait to see what interesting things we get up. The children have worked really hard in maths this week showing their skills of subtraction. After half term we will begin looking at numbers to 50, using all of the skills we have learnt so far this year. Have a lovely half term break and we will see you soon.

Sennen:

Sennen have had a busy week - we have explored people who help us in the community and made signs to help others look after our community. In English we have written Street Diaries of the views from our windows, using some super language choices. In Guided Reading we completed our book Home, the children truly loved exploring this book and noticing links from one page to another. In Maths we have been exploring shape and investigated which shapes have lines of symmetry - I wonder if you can find any symmetrical shapes around your house? Over half term see if you can practise your common exception words - I have sent home a sheet so you can have a go at home! Have an enjoyable and well-earned half term.
