Another fab week for Kynance. The children have been incredibly interested in minibeasts this week. We have found a cocoon, which, after much research, is going to turn into a moth! We will observe the changes of the cocoon and will hopefully see it transform! We have had some great writing linked to this finding. We have also written our own class book called 'The Alien and The Superhero'. Ask your child about our story! We have enhanced our writing area with story making resources and the children have loved this! We also have some new den building resources that the children have made a tent with!

#### Gwithian:

This week has seen Gwithian class writing instructions to make a woodland crown, then going into the woods to make it themselves. They have also been working really hard on their phonics, identifying sounds and blending them to read. The children are making fantastic progress in their reading, thank you for your support and efforts at home. In maths we have studied taller and shorter. We have enjoyed many trips to the school woods for literacy, maths, science and art this week - this topic is proving to be popular! All this research has been really helpful as we write our leaflets. The children have written a wonderful introduction and next week we will continue to write the rest of our leaflets. In Maths we have been practising our calculation skills including addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Keep practising your x2, x5 and x10 time's tables and number bonds at home. Finally on Friday we had a really exciting visit from Amanda Lorens who is teaching us all about animation - over the day on Friday and next Tuesday we will be creating our animations for our Under the Clock: Revealing City Hall project. #### Pentire:

During Literacy, in Pentire class, we will be explaining the water cycle. In Maths, we are continuing to look at decimals and rounding. In Topic, we will be looking at mountains around the world and the people who live there. During science, we are investigating the water cycle and experimenting to create a miniature water cycle in a pot. We will continue to develop our Spanish skills by learning to count to ten.

#### Marazion:

During Literacy, we will be focusing on identifying grammatical features. In maths we will be continuing to learn about decimals in Year 5 and revising our current embedded skills in Year 6. During science we will be continuing to focus on identifying the difference between what
