

TLA Behaviour Policy

The behaviour policy at TLA is underpinned through the promotion of good behaviour, self-discipline and respect, as outlined in the school rules:

We follow instructions
We show respect
We are calm
We are ready to learn

Rewards: House Point Tickets

Children are given House Points by any member of the school staff for following the school rules. House points are collated over the course of each half term and the House with the majority of points wins an end of term treat. Children are also presented with House Point Tickets, when awarded House Points, and are reminded of the rule they are following by the adult. Children then place the House Point Ticket in the appropriate container, which will automatically enter the child into a weekly draw for a prize for following the school rules.

Sanctions

Across the school there is a 3-step behavior system to remind children about the behavioral expectations at TLA. Children's names are displayed on a behavior chart and are moved, when necessary, through the different steps:

Step 1: Children who do not follow the school rules are moved to Step 1 and the adult in charge explains which school rule the child has not followed.

Step 2: For a child who is already on Step 1 and who has, for a second time, not followed the school rules. Again, the child is reminded of the school rules and the rule they have not met.

Step 3: For a child whose name was on Step 2, and who has for a third time, not followed the school rules. Also, if a child has seriously physically hurt another child then that child can be moved directly to Step 3.

Children reaching Step 3 will be sent to work in another classroom or miss playtime, depending on the incident. They will be spoken to by the Head of School.

Consequences

If a child does make it to Step 3 then parents may be contacted by the Head of School and a child may lose privileges for the following day. The Head of School can also decide if a child may be taught outside of the classroom.
