Kynance Class—

The children have quickly settled back, and have taught me the class routines.

Our maths has been a counting focus this week, making sure we are 'clever counting'. (Ensuring we touch each item as we count it). We have been busy learning to whoosh in when writing our sounds. Many children have chosen to practise using whiteboards and pens.

CLASS NEWS

Next week, we will begin our new dinosaur topic. The children have some exciting ideas-including making a dinosaur discovery.

Our PE day is Thursday, please ensure kits are in school. In EYFS the children enjoy the outdoor area whatever the weather. Although we have wellies and waterproofs in school, sometimes they still need a change of clothes. If possible, please provide a spare set of clothes and socks in your child's bag. Gwithian Class—

Next week Gwithian will be innovating 'Whatever Next'. In Maths we are exploring 3D shapes, including making them out of marshmallows and cocktail sticks! In Science we are going to continue to explore weather, and create our own weather forecast for the week. In Topic we are exploring the counties that make up Great Britain and the UK.

Sennen Class-

Next week in Sennen Class, we are going to be starting our Fiction unit 'The Great Fire of London'. We will start the week predicting what might happen in the text and then spend the rest of the week learning the text using actions and symbols. In Maths next week, we are having a week on Fractions, looking at finding fractions of shapes and then fractions of amounts. In Science, we are going to be thinking about what materials are man-made and what materials are natural. In Topic, we are going to be writing a recount about our trip to the fire station.

Fistral Class—

Next week we will be learning about symmetry using a variety of regular and irregular 2 D shapes. We will be learning about the famous mountaineer Edmund Hillary and studying the features of a biography. We will also examine mountain ranges in the United Kingdom and across the world and observe how they change the landscape.

Pentire Class—

Next week in Pentire, we will be immersing ourselves in the story' the wreck of the Zanzibar' by Michael Morpurgo. We will be analysing the main characters and learning the story by creating story maps and using drama to act out parts of the story. In maths, we will be continuing to use our problem solving and reasoning skills in measuring distance. We will be finding out about different units of measurement and we will be applying our skills in addition and subtraction by solving word problems. In science, we will be exploring states of matter. Having found out about properties of solids, liquids and gases, we will now be learning more about how different materials can change their state. In topic work, we will be learning about how the coastlines differ across the United Kingdom and how geology of the land plays a big part in how our coastlines are formed

Marazion Class—

In English next week, Marazion will identify the features of newspaper reports with a focus on the 5Ws. During SPaG, we will practise writing reported and direct speech.

During maths next week, Marazion will multiply simple pairs of proper fractions and divide proper fractions by whole numbers.

In science, we will explore how mirrors reflect light, and how

they can help us see objects. We will also explain that we see things because light travels from light sources to our eyes or from light sources to objects and then to our eyes.
