Kynance:

What another wonderful week for Kynance! This week has naturally led to lots of Maths. With bread-making leading to Mathematical vocabulary linking to capacity, estimations and measurement and loose parts leading to explorations of how to make 5 in lots of ways, we have certainly been using our brains to make Mathematical links! We have been focusing on lots of personal, social and emotional development and have noticed lots of positive comments from school adults addressing the skills in which children are developing: resilience, independent conflict resolution and kindness. These are skills learnt throughout the whole of Reception and are expected to be natural and 'built-in' in the Summer Term. We expect conflict to occur daily, but it is of importance that we address skills within the crucial moment, so please trust that we are dealing with conflict in school when we are aware of it. I want to remind you that we also have an open door policy and are here to address any concerns that you have so please use this for your benefit. **A reminder that we need wellies and coats in school every day and please name everything that your child has; we have lots of jumpers/cardigans/shoes/PE kits/water bottles not named.**

Star of the week: Poppy for trying incredibly hard in everything and showing fantastic resilience and motivation in her spoken language.

Community: Hattie for developing a positive attitude towards coming to school, for trying hard to listen to instructions and for helping to tidy our classroom.

Gwithian:

Gwithian class have had a great week working on their part whole models in maths to support their early addition skills. Perhaps ask the children to show you what we have been doing this week! Next week we will begin solving addition calculations, using our understanding of the part whole model. In literacy the children have completed a number of activities linked to our story 'Grandma's Bill' they have made predictions, written speech bubbles, taken on role play and identified characters and events from within the story. Next week we will be looking at speech marks within the story and what these mean, as well as working on using finger spaces between words when completing writing tasks. We have begun learning about Hinduism in RE and will be making our own diya lamps next week. Science will see the children exploring their senses and history lessons will show them how babies change into adults through playing a game of 'Guess the teacher' by looking at their baby pictures. **Please make sure you check your child's book bag regularly for letters, homework and spellings.**

Star of the week: Alexis for trying really hard in all areas of learning to improve her work and understanding.

TLA Community: Eva-Rose for showing empathy towards others; always supporting, helping and encouraging her peers.

Home learner: Alfie W for consistent, high quality homework. A great family tree this week!

Sennen: have had a busy week. We have been learning the story of Mr Gumpy's motor car, the children have explored the story by thinking about the characters and plot, ready to write our own story next week. In Maths we have been learning formal addition and subtraction strategies. The class have worked so hard and I'm very proud of their progress. Keep practising your number bonds and doubles which will keep these skills sharp. We have also learnt the story of The Gunpowder Plot in History. In RE we learnt the seasonal story of Hanukkah. The children are loving our Guided Reading story "Home" and have created some wonderful role play and ideas linked to settings. We have also learnt about materials and their properties linked to house and homes.

Fistral: We have continued to work hard this week and are really enjoying the Stone Age topic. We have been learning the Stone Age Boy story and have acted out parts of the story. Linked to this, we have been looking at cave paintings and have created our own paintings using twigs and our fingers! In English, we have started learning about spoken reports and have been collecting Stone Age information in preparation for presenting our own spoken reports to the class. In science we have started our new topic of light by identifying light sources. **A polite reminder - Please ensure that children have their PE kits on school all week. Our PE lesson is on Tuesday afternoons but this is subject to change due to timetable changes or special events**

Pentire: In maths we have been using our knowledge of addition and exchange to solve a variety of puzzles and problems. In English, we have been writing diaries about our visit to Restormel Castle. We have also been practising our play about 'The Battle of Hastings' which we performed to parents on Friday. We were delighted to see family members sharing in our learning and thank all of those who attended. We have been designing our own version of the Bayeaux Tapestry to show what life is like in modern England so our future generations can learn about our modern lives today.
