










Gwithian class have worked extremely hard this week and have settled in brilliantly. Next week in Literacy we will be looking at making wanted posters for The Evil Pea from our focus story 'Supertato' and creating our own super veggie fact files with emphasis on letter formation and finger spaces between words. In maths, we will be continuing our work on representing numbers by looking at addition, subtraction and number bonds to 10. We will be learning about appropriate behaviours and linking them to what superheroes do and why they are good role models, along with taking a look at some real life heroes.

Sennen:

We have had a fantastic week in Sennen class. The children have written brilliant stories linked to Jack and the Beanstalk. They have used past tense. powerful verbs and adjectives to make their writing exciting. In Maths, we have been exploring number and place value - practising counting in 2s, 5s and 10s at home would really help our learning next week. In Science, we have explored Cacti and in Art, we created our own beautiful leaves using wire and tissue paper. We have also been learning about Rainforests and how countries nearest the Equator are the hottest. A reminder that we need Eden trip money.

Fistral:

This week Fistral class have had a busy week immersing in our English topic. We have followed a recipe to make a potion, taken notes on how to make a banana loaf and found the features of recipe writing. In the afternoons this week we have learnt about the 5 food groups.

This week has seen Pentire class travel deeper into the mysterious world of the Demon Dentist. The children will continue to explore the story further next week during our literacy sessions. We will also be taking a practical look at the inside of the body and exploring the features and functions of the digestive system as our topic work continues. The maths focus next week is partitioning numbers.

Marazion:

Next week in Marazion class we will be analysing speech in texts and beginning to create our own war time stories. In maths we will be focusing on place value; comparing and ordering numbers up to 1,000,000 and rounding up to 1,000,000. We will be investigating ways to split white light in science and in topic we will be constructing a structurally sound, miniature Anderson shelter.
