CLASS NEWS Kynance Class—

This week we have become explorers. Inside we have our dinosaur museum and outdoors Kynance explorers spotted a mysterious egg. Some of the children think it could be a dinosaur egg. We have written signs, and sent letters to Andy from Cbeebies; as the children are sure he has lots of knowledge on dinosaurs. We are eagerly waiting to see if he replies! Our number focus this week has been addition. In practical activities we have used the language of plus, add, double and total.

The children enjoy the outdoors in all weathers. We have had a big chat this week about wearing sensible clothes for different activities. The children know they need to wear wellies and waterproofs for water play and aprons for messy play. Please could you chat to your child about this at home. Thank you for your continued support.

Gwithian Class—

Another great week for Gwithian this week! Next week we will be starting our non-fiction English topic - letter-writing. We will be receiving a letter from Whatever Next's Baby Bear after he has crashed into the garden (don't tell the children please!). In Maths we are making patterns with 2D shapes and repeating 3D patterns. In Science we will be looking at clothing for different weather conditions and in Topic we will be continuing our enhanced provision around out Topic. The children are learning lots from their supervised play. They are trying incredibly hard at their pre-cursive and their handwriting has improved tremendously. Well done, we are so proud!

Sennen Class-

Next week in Sennen Class we are going to be innovating our class story, changing it to 'The Great Flood of Truro'. We will be focusing on using different suffixes to help us with our spelling. In Maths we will are going to be having a week on multiplication and division, revising the arrays that we use to answer these calculations. In Topic next week we are going to be learning London's Burning and will perform it using musical instruments.

Fistral Class—

Next week in Fistral the children will be continuing their work on fractions in maths. They will be singing songs about the mountains in music and in science will be identifying how rocks are formed, alongside a treasure hunt for their uses. In English Year 3 will be writing out the story of 'When I was young in the Mountains' and in Y4 they will be inventing their own story based on the 'Wreck of the Zanzibar.

Pentire Class-

Next week in Pentire, we will be continuing to apply our addition and subtraction skills. We will be learning how to check our calculations by using the inverse operation.

In literacy we will be inventing our own stories based on our class novel' the wreak of the Zanzibar.' We will be using our innovated stories as a source of inspiration.

In R.E we will be exploring our pilgrimage can be a special part of the Christian faith and what special trips and journeys mean to us.

In our topic work, we will be finding what the impact of coastal erosion has on our local human and physical environment.

Marazion Class—

In English next week, Marazion will continue to plan and draft a newspaper report about the race to the South Pole. We will focus on including direct and reported speech as well as relative clauses.

During maths next week, Marazion will focus on further developing their arithmetic skills and will solve problems, which require answers to be rounded to specified degrees of accuracy.

In science, we will be investigating how we can reflect and refract light and we will write up our results, including scientific vocabulary.
