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Kynance: Another fabulous week. Kynance have thoroughly enjoyed our enhanced provision this week and have taken a natural interest in making obstacle courses for our programmed robot and for building famous buildings using our blocks. We have been comparing amounts of objects by identifying more than/greater than using our greedy alligator (who always eats the biggest number!). The children have had a blast at the disco and have been introduced to our class 'baby'. The care in which they show the baby and each other is truly amazing and we are so proud of all of their achievements. We are blown away by their growing resilience, kindness and we are particularly overwhelmed by their phonics progress thanks to our team, their hard work and your support at home.

Gwithian: This week our class have worked extremely hard in maths on addition using the + symbol. They are really confident in answering addition calculations and next week we will begin to look at some problem solving around this. In literacy they have begun to think about writing about past events in preparation to write a diary entry next week. Lots of discussion about what they do at the weekend will support them in remembering and thinking of their memories when writing their diaries. The children created their Diva Lamps out of clay and have begun to decorate them - this will continue next week and they will explore the traditions of a Hindu wedding in RE. In science they will explore further about our senses. Nativity singing practice is in full swing, so we apologise if you get the catchy songs being sung all the time at home; they're stuck in our heads too! You should have received a letter regarding your child's role in the nativity and a letter about a class trip to Truro Museum. Please see me if you did not receive these. This weeks spellings are Set 7 from the 'Spellzoo' booklet sent home earlier in the week.

Sennen: This week the class have been working hard to complete their stories in English, I was so proud of their effort, care and attention when writing. Keep practising your beautiful handwriting at home. In Maths we have been exploring Money, the children found it tricky at first but have persevered. Keep practising at home - perhaps you could help with the shopping this week! We have also been comparing houses in Victorian times and modern day in History. In Geography we have looked at different map symbols and how to follow a map. In Science we have continued to explore materials and their properties and why different objects are made from specific materials - what materials can you find around your house? We are really looking forward to our excursion around the community next week - please let me or Miss Saunders know if you can accompany us on this walk.

Fistral: In English we have been looking at spoken reports and have been researching and recording facts about the Stone Age in preparation for presenting our reports to each other next week. In guided reading the children have really enjoyed the story of The Stone Age Boy and have written some wonderful letters describing how they went back in time to the Stone Age, how they felt and what they saw. In maths we have started subtracting 3 digit numbers. We have continued to think about the work of archaeologists and have looked at aerial photographs of the school grounds to help us decide on a good place to carry out our archaeological dig. The children are really enjoying their topic and have brought in some fantastic pieces of homework. Please keep them coming so they can be displayed in the classroom.

Pentire: In maths, we have been learning about subtraction with exchange. In English, we have been reading about teeth, retrieving information from the text to answer questions and creating persuasive posters using the computers. We have researched the question, 'Does the youngest child in class have the most milk teeth?' by examining how many milk and second teeth we each have. We have studied the Sikh Baptism service, Amrit, and learned a Spanish Song. We have celebrated 'World Diabetes Day' and learned how to deal with bullying in an anti-bullying assembly. Next week, we will continue our teeth investigations. A letter will come home about permission for your child to use a disclosing tablet to identify any areas which need targeting brushing. We will also be finding out how much sugar there is in certain foods and drinks so the children can make informed choices.

As we start to think about building our own rollercoasters, we are going to investigate what type of materials we can use to make our coasters go faster.
