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Kynance: In Maths this week in Kynance we have been exploring 'one more' than a given amount. We have almost finished learning all of Set 1 sounds in phonics and we are overwhelmed by the progress that we are seeing in such a short time. The children have been practising writing captions and using the red word 'I' - some amazing pieces of independent writing has been occurring and we are feeling very proud! The children have also been helping with our daily calendar: we know the days of the week and have been identifying the weather, season, month and date. The children have been showing their kind and caring nature towards each other, for example helping each other zip up coats. Seeing them progress so much in a few weeks is so incredibly rewarding.

We would love to see some more parental engagement with Tapestry as we hear all of the fun things that are happening at home and would love to share them in class. This also supports our assessments, particularly with the 'People and Communities' aspect of our curriculum, linking to family customs and routines. Gwithian: A great week for Gwithian class and their diary writing in Literacy. In maths they have begun working on addition fact families within 10. The children have started to independently explore books about toys from the past and identify any similarities and differences between then and present day toys. Next week we will look into this further. We have completed our learning about the story Grandma's Bill and next week, we will start a new story and look at story mapping. We will start looking at antiques next in preparation for out museum visit. Please let me know if you are able to join us on the 6th Dec as we currently do not have enough adults for the trip to go ahead.

Please can we ask that you do not allow your children to bring in items from home unless they are directly linked to our topic or a personal achievement? We ask due to many children asking throughout the day to share their items and we do not always have time resulting in children becoming upset. If children are bringing in personal achievements or items relating to our topic please can you prepare them to talk to the class about it - we will then keep it safe in the classroom cupboard until we have time for news sharing, but we cannot promise this will be every day. Sennen: We have had a super week being Street Detectives! We have had a special visit from Mrs Thomas who told us all about Truro in the past. We then did some beautiful writing about what we had learnt. We have also been continuing our theme of life in the past by learning some Nursery Rhymes. Next week we will continue this theme by writing our own rhyming couplets. Perhaps you could explore some nursery rhymes at home too? We have also been looking at maps using the laptops and exploring different parts of Truro using Google maps. We learnt about shops in the past in History and different Materials and the Properties in Science where we made houses out of different materials. In Maths we have continued with Money by looking at the difference and finding change, keep practising these skills this weekend by going to the shops and working out the change.

Fistral: We have had a fantastic week collecting facts about the Stone Age which we used to produce a spoken report. The classroom was turned into a news studio and the children did a fantastic job presenting their reports to each other. Next week, we will be looking at the features of nonchronological reports and beginning to plan writing our own reports.

In topic, we cleaned, identified and classified the artefacts we discovered during our archaeological dig. In science we have been investigating reflective materials and what they are used for. In maths, we have begun subtraction from three digit numbers.

Pentire: In maths, we have been learning how to solve one and two step word problems involving addition and subtraction. We have been writing anti-bullying Haiku poems, diary entries about 'Babe's' experience of a sheep dog trial and we have carried out three science investigations to identify which cereals contain the most sugar, which drink contains the most sugar and where plaque builds up on our teeth

Next week, we will begin multiplication in maths, learn about the digestive system and about Sikh duties and vows (The 5 K's).
