<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>Visit a local city and take some photos of what you can see there.</p> <p>Stick them into your book and write a sentence about them.</p> <p>Look at the different types of buildings, sizes, shapes, transport, amount of people etc.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Geography</p> <p>Research some tourist attractions in London, Create a collage with captions explaining what each attraction is.</p> <p>You may have visited some before and would like to include photos and tickets.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Geography</p> <p>Create and label a picture or map of a fantasy city. What type of buildings would be in your city and what would they look like? What transport would people use in this city?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic / ICT</p> <p>Search the internet with an adult to find images of different cities in the world. Create a scrapbook of your favourite cities and include pictures, labels and captions. Can you find and record a short fact about each city?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Literacy</p> <p>Visit your local library with an adult and search for non-fiction, fiction or poetry books about cities. Read and enjoy them with an adult or your class.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">DT/ART</p> <p>Design (and bake if you wish) a food that may have been found in Pudding Lane bakery during The Great Fire of London</p> <p>(We will learn about The Great Fire a few weeks into the term - it may be best to save this until we have begun to learn about it)</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">DT/ART</p> <p>Make a cityscape artwork and bring it to school to share with the class.</p> <p>This could be a drawing, painting, 3d model or presented in any way you like!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>Create a 2-D city shape picture. Can you label the shape names? What are the properties of the shapes in your picture?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;">Literacy</p> <p>Make a mini book of your city visit, showing the transport and buildings you saw. Label the pictures.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Topic</p> <p>Draw a picture of the Queen and write some facts about her that you know. Then write what you would like to find out about her during our learning.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">DT</p> <p>Build a real or fantasy city using Lego, blocks or 3-D junk material from home.
